Quick Easy Mince Pasta Bake

2 Onions finely diced
1-1.5kg Mince (I used a large tray - approx 1.3kgs)
2 Jars of mushroom & herb pasta sauce (eg Raguletto)
1 1/2 packets of penne (or spirals) pasta cooked & drained
1 cup sour cream
grated cheese for on top
Heat oil in frying pan and brown onion & mince well.
Add pasta sauce and simmer for further 10mins.
Stir through pasta and sour cream.

Place all in large baking dishes. Sprinkle with grated cheese.

Bake for 15-20mins til cheese nicely melted.

Serve with salad & garlic bread if desired.
