- The Eustachian tube becomes blocked. (This tube joins the middle ear to the back of the nose & throat.)
- Large tonsils or adenoids.
- Colds and flu.
- Chest infections.
- Allergies.
- Cigarette smoke.
- Bottle Feeding.





(Do not lie your baby down when bottle feeding. Milk gathers at the entrance of the Eustachian tube and gives bacteria a warm area to grow in.)
