

School Planning

Week 6, Term 4

The School Planning Committee has reviewed all returned responses around the new Strategic Directions, School Context, Vision Statement and Consultation Process. We would like to thank the community for contributing to the future direction of the school and that the overwhelming majority shared our vision and ethos for Yetman Public School. The decision to move forward with the following two Strategic Directions has been made:

Thursday 13 November 2014

1 – Delivering high quality teaching and learning programs to equip students with the necessary literacy and numeracy skills to be successful 21st century learners.

2 – Maintaining and increasing teacher and leadership capacity throughout the school to provide students with highly skilled, technologically proficient and critically reflective teachers in every classroom as well as instructional leadership to foster best practice of education across the school.

The committee is now moving to determine the best process and strategy to underpin each of these directions.

Student Welfare Policy

At the last P&C Meeting, I tabled the new Student Welfare Policy. Copies were left and the draft version was made available on our school website. The ratification of this policy is due by Week 7 and if no changes or comments are drawn by the end of Week 7, I will finalise the policy.

Macintyre Young Writers Awards (MYW)

It is with great pride that I announce that Yetman Public School students were awarded 10 of the MYW awards that were held last Thursday evening. This wonderful literacy event was entered by all our students this year (Yr 1-6) and resulted in our little school demonstrating the great skill and focus that we are developing in writing. During the presentation, it was announced that senior award winners will be offered the chance to attend a writing camp next year. Congratulations!

Professional Learning

Over the past few weeks, I have been out of school and attending leadership conferences steeped in building sustainable capacity in teaching staff. The professional learning and commitment involved in continual growth as a teacher cannot be underestimated. For this very reason and the fact that the greatest contributor to student achievement is the quality of the teacher in the classroom, provides scope for both the outlined strategic directions (above). Our new school plan will encompass teacher quality and this will provide better quality learning programs, interactions and inturn results.

Speech Advice

The Year 5 students have been sent home a letter pertaining to the School Captain Speech Day which is set for December 3rd. The letter outlined what the school is looking for in a school leader and I provide the following advice in relation to the speech:

Eye contact – student can hold the attention of the audience with direct eye contact, seldom looking at notes

Body Language – fluid and help the audience visualize the speech (not over the top) Poise – Student is relaxed, self-confident and calm

Elocution – student uses a clear voice and correct pronunciation of terms so that all the audience can hear the speech



In Science, we have grown a spring onion from an old onion and observed an avocado seed do nothing over the same time period.






We have also observed the effects of salinity in water and its impact on plants.
