


Regional athletics




Inverell Eisteddfod

BROCCOLI AND CHEESE MINI MUFFINS

PREP TIME

COOK TIME

TOTAL TIME

Author: kidgredients Serves: 24 mini muffins

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup milk
- 1 cup srf flour
- 1 cup wholemeal srf
- 1 and ¼ cups cooked broccoli, smushed and chopped up
- 1 cup grated cheddar
- 1.5 tsps dired thyme
- 1 egg
- 2 tbsps olive oil





INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 180 degrees.
- 2. Mix all the ingredients together.
- 3. Don't overmix.
- 4. Put the muffins into mini muffin trays and bake for 18 minutes.
- 5. Cool on a wire rack.

Apple-Berry Cream Cheese Scrolls

Ingredients

30g cold butter or dairy spread. 2 cups self raising flour 3/4 cup milk

1/2 cup spreadable cream cheese

- I teaspoon cinnamon.
- I apple, finely chopped
- I cup fresh or frozen raspberries
- 2 tablespoons caster sugar



Method

 Rub spread into the sifted flour until mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs. Make a well in the centre, add milk all at once and mix to a soft dough. Turn out onto a lightly floured surface and knead lightly.

2. Boll out dough to a 1cm thick rectangle. Spread with cream cheese, sprinkle with cinnamon and then fruit and sugar. Roll up as for a Swiss roll and cut into 12 slices with a sharp serrated knife, wiping the knife between each cut.

3. Snuggly fit the scrolls into a 20cm x 30cm baking paper lined deep baking tray or slice tin and bake at 220°C for 15-20 minutes or until golden and cooked. Serve warm or cool with a class of milk!

Tips / Handy Hints

Preparation time: 30 minutes. Cooking time: 20 minutes. Try using mixed betwies instead of raspberries in these scrolls. Also try other trust combinations such as apple and suitana, banana and date or apricot and slivered almonds.
