


The Book Parade was a great success with lots of amazing costumes from all the staff and students, and even Tharawonga joined in! For more photos from book parade head over to the schools website.

# **K-2 All Stars News**

This term we have started a unit of work about persuasive text. We have read lots of different stories that are in this genre (e.g. Don't Let the Pigeon Drive the Bus, Don't Let the Pigeon Stay Up Late, The Three Little Pigs, The Three Kangaroos Gruff, Let's Get a Dog, Olga the Brolga). We have discussed many characters and are learning to give our opinions and the reasons for our opinions about them. # Gooking Glub

Students are again enjoying Cooking Club. Lately due to popular demand we have made **Orange Cupcakes** twice using the oranges from our tree.

#### **Ingredients**

125g butter, softened

1/4 cup milk

1/4 cup orange juice

2 eggs

3/4 cup sugar

1 1/2 cups SR flour

1 tbsp. orange zest, finely grated

For icing

1/3 cup butter, softened

1 1/2 cups icing sugar

2 tbsp. orange juice



#### Method

Preheat oven to 180c and line muffin tray
Combine all cake ingredients in a large
bowl and beat thoroughly for 3 minutes
Pour mixture into cup cake papers
Bake in the oven for approximately 15
minutes or until cooked through
Allow to cool while making icing
Mix orange icing ingredients together in a
bowl and ice cakes

We are also experimenting with making healthy vegetable chips. So far we have tried kale and sweet potato.

#### **Kale Chips**

#### **Ingredients**

1 bunch of kale

2 tbsp. parmesan cheese

1/2 tsp chilli flakes (optional)

2tsp finely grated lemon rind

Spray oil

#### Method

Preheat oven to 180c and line 2 baking trays with baking paper.

Remove and discard tough stems

from kale, tear leaves in to bite size

pieces.

Combine kale, parmesan, chilli flakes and lemon rinds in a large bowl.

Spread kale mixture over prepared trays and spray with oil.

Cook for 8 to 10 minutes and cool before serving.

#### **Sweet Potato Chips**

#### **Ingredients**

Salt

Sweet potato

Oil

#### Method

Pre heat oven to between 180°c and 200°c.

Peel the skin off the sweet potato.

Using the peeler again peel strips of sweet potato and put on a tray.

Cover with oil and cook 15mins.

Sprinkle with salt and serve warm.
